## **Objectives**

- 1. Introduces viewers to a shark species often considered dangerous to humans and helps to explain why they are not generally dangerous at all.
- 2. Demonstrates interaction between humans and a large shark species.

## Questions for before watching the program

- 1. How do hammerhead sharks get their name?
- 2. What is the largest species of hammerhead shark?
- 3. What do Great Hammerheads eat? Do they attack people?
- 4. What is the purpose of a hammerhead shark's head shape?

## Discussion for after watching the program

- 1. How does the dive team attract the Great Hammerheads? Was it easy?
- 2. Why do you think it takes a long time to get the sharks to come close?
- 3. Normally Great Hammerheads are very shy around divers and won't come close. Why are these different?
- 4. What is the pile of junk on the sea floor doing there?
- 5. What is the hammer of a hammerhead called? What does *cephalofoil* actually mean?
- 6. Internet research: what is the most prevalent theory on why the head has evolved to that shape? (You can also check out our season 1 hammerhead video to learn)
- 7. Why do the hammerheads have a hard time eating some of the bait?
- 8. Did the Great Hammerheads seem aggressive at all towards divers?
